Woollen gloves
Toothbrush and toothpaste
Soap (might not be a bad idea)
Writing materials and stamps.

The following articles are also suggested; notebook, diary, pencils, "books, camera, compass, fishing tackle, telescope or binoculars, cards, musical instruments, personal first aid kit, torch, mending gear (needle thread etc.) penknife, frame rucksack, sense of humour. You would also find any small tents, stoves, cooking dixies etc. that you possess very useful for any bivouacs that you may go on.

All articles should be clearly marked. A stout pair of boots are essential and if they are new, it is a very good idea to break them in before the expedition. I would also remind you the transistor radios are forbidden on SHS expeditions.
